- **1. Welcome and Call to Order**: The President determined the presence of a quorum and called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
- **2. Proceedings of Previous Meeting:** Upon a motion by Ned Kuhns and a second by Mark Ferguson, the Board approved the minutes of the September Board meeting.
- **3. Finance Report**: Douglas Cary presented the Treasurer's report.
- **4. President's Report:** Rosanne Cary covered the following: for 2021, we have a high number of vacancies on the Board. A Nominating Committee chair and committee members still need to be identified to present a slate of officers by the December member meeting. So far, members have expressed willingness to be nominated as follows:

5. Chair's Reports:

 <u>ATC Rep</u> – Ned Kuhns reported the virtual Volunteer Leadership Academy is focusing on "JEDI": Justice, Equality, Diversity and Inclusion;

Ned and Jim Newman will attend the VA Regional Partnership Committee meeting on Oct. 24th;

• <u>Trail Supervisor</u> – Jim Neumann has organized a group of 18 members for Fall trail maintenance on Oct. 16-18. Covid-19 requirements will be met. Work will be primarily at Maupin Field to install new fire rings and tent pads, as well as on White Rock Falls trail to remove a downed tree.

A misting machine from the USFS will be used to sanitize the privy. If possible, on Sunday morning, a crew will work on the Harpers Creek shelter.

In addition to the \$1,137 grant from ATC, three other expenditures are necessary for the Maupin Field work:

- Approximately \$100 to complete purchase of the fire rings;
- Approximately \$700 for rock chips for the tent pads;
- Approximately \$200 for quikcrete, sand and stakes for the fire rings

Ned will determine if an additional ATC grant is available to cover these expenses. If not, on a motion by Dave Plum and a second by Ned Kuhns, the Board voted to approve these three expenditures to complete the work at Maupin Field.

- <u>Membership</u> Sharon Salyer reported sending 6 new member packets. There are currently approximately 435 members in the club.
- <u>Education</u> Lee Lohman is researching an appropriate place to archive presentations. He is also planning an educational event for October on cold weather camping and for November on navigation (dates TBD).
- Outreach Rosemary Plum reported that TATC meeting notices are now being published in the Virginian Pilot.
